2a Nomination and Application

Nominations:

Official nominations are to be sent by Home Universities through our online form in [Mobility Online](#). The Partner Institutions receive the username and password via email in order to access the form and submit the nomination of their outgoing students.

Nomination deadlines:

Autumn/Winter Terms and Full Year – from 15th March to 30th April
Spring Terms – from 1st September to 15th October

Applications:

Application instructions will be automatically e-mailed to all nominated students. The online Application for Exchange students is made of 3-STEPS which must be completed by the following deadlines:

Application deadlines:

Autumn/Winter Terms and Full Year

- 15th May: step 1 and 2 (Registration and Application form on Uniweb)
- 15th June: step 3 (completion of personal details in Mobility Online and LA upload)

Spring Terms

- 31st October: step 1 and 2 (Registration and Application form on Uniweb)
- 30th November: step 3 (to fill in personal details in Mobility Online and LA upload)

Language requirements

- B1 English level, for students attending courses in English
- A2 Italian level, for students attending courses in Italian

Documents accepted: OLS test results, official language certificates (i.e. TOEFL, IELTS, Cambridge University, etc.), Duolingo English test, attendance certificates of intensive courses, certificates issued by University officers/professors attesting the language proficiency level, transcript of records including language exams results

2b Nominations for the School of Medicine

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING THE SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

The Mobility Unit is responsible only for incoming students who have obtained an **Erasmus+ for Studies scholarship**. All certificates related to their mobility (e.g., attendance certificates, Learning Agreements, etc.) will therefore be issued exclusively using the Erasmus+ for Studies templates.

Students are required to attend at least one course unit during their mobility.

Practical training / clinical rotations

- **Medicine and Surgery:**

Clinical rotations for students in Medicine and Surgery are all held at hospitals in Padua. However, due to limited and unpredictable Hospital availability, the clinical rotations specified in the Learning Agreement (LA) **cannot be guaranteed**, even after the LA has been approved. Students may therefore be required to modify their LA accordingly.

- **Nursing and Physiotherapy:**

Students in the study fields of Nursing and Physiotherapy who undertake practical training/clinical rotations during their mobility may be assigned to **different campuses**, located both in Padua and in other cities (see the next paragraph). Students will have the option to indicate their preferences; however, placements will be assigned based on availability.

- Clinical rotations in the field of Physiotherapy may take place at one of the following four campuses: Venice, Padua, Conegliano, or Schio.
- Clinical rotations in the field of Nursing may take place at one of the following eight campuses: Feltre, Mestre, Monselice, Padua, Portogruaro, Rovigo, Schio, Treviso.

Each of these campuses may serve as a venue for teaching and training activities. Incoming students will be assigned to one of these campuses after completing their application on Mobility Online. An official communication regarding the assigned campus will be sent to students after their nomination is confirmed.

Transcript of Records for practical trainings/clinical rotations

Practical trainings will not appear on the final Transcript of Records. Students will receive a separate certificate, called "Addendum to the Transcript of Records", certifying the conclusion of their practical training, including information regarding the duration, the ECTS, and the obtained score during the clinical rotations.

Halls of residence

Due to the limited number of places available in the students' halls of residence, **only students with visual, hearing or motor disability and students taking part in selected Programmes can apply for accommodation (Bilateral Agreements and Erasmus+ KA171 from third countries not associated to Erasmus+, Double/Joint Degree).**

These students will be invited by email to fill in an Accommodation form in order to request a place. The rooms will be assigned based on the chronological order of the requests. We cannot guarantee that all applicants will be assigned a room.

In case a few places are still available after the first round of room allocations, **students from other programmes (Erasmus+ KA131 from Programme Countries, ARQUS, SEMP, SEN Coimbra Group and UK Universities)** will be invited via email to apply for a place in the dorms. Non-European citizens who need a study visa to enter and stay in Italy will be prioritized.

Private housing

The Mobility Unit will send to all nominated students a guide on accommodation, containing information and tips on the search of private housing in Padua and surroundings.

Students can search for private rooms/apartments on *HousingAnywhere*, an international housing platform through which they can book a room/apartment offered by verified private landlords and by outgoing students. Rooms offered by outgoing students can be easily recognized thanks to the "Verified Student" VIP badge on their profile.

Students can easily identify the course units they are allowed to attend, with the label *"The course unit can be attended by Erasmus+ and other exchange students"*.

Note: This label will be visible from **June 2026**.

Exchange students should carefully read the Guide *"How to choose courses at Unipd"* ([available here](#)) which contains instructions on how to browse the Course Catalogue, how to fill out the Learning Agreement and on the **restrictions on course units** for exchange students.

The **start and end dates** mentioned in the course catalogue are the general term dates. You can check the real start date of your classes on the [timetable portal](#) (fully updated a few weeks before the start of the courses).

Language of instruction

The main language of instruction at Unipd is Italian, but we offer a large number of complete degree courses and course units held in English. The teaching language is stated in every course unit page in the Course Catalogue, so make sure to check this info for each course unit.

Credit and grading

Unipd uses the ECTS credit transfer system.

The grades for each exam successfully passed can range from 18 to 30. In case of exceptional performance, the grade is 30 cum laude. In some courses, the grade can be expressed instead as "fail", "sufficient", "satisfactory", "good", "very good" or "excellent".

For other courses and activities, such as the Italian Language Laboratory for exchange students (3 ECTS), the positive assessment is not expressed in terms of a grade but simply as "Pass".

Standard course load

20-30 ECTS per semester is the average/suggested amount for exchange students (**not** mandatory for Unipd!).

30 ECTS is the standard full-time semester load for degree seeking students.

1 ECTS credit equals 25 hours of study, including contact hours and self-study.

Course registration

Students do not need to enroll formally in course units.

Two online platforms are used for course and exam registration:

- "[Uniweb](#)" student portal: students must fill out a study plan here, which will allow them to sign up for exams at the end of the classes.
- "[Moodle](#)" teaching platforms: professors use it to share teaching materials with students and give info about the course unit. It is recommended to register in each course unit before classes start.

Examinations

Each exam session usually offers 1 or 2 exam dates for each course. It is possible to sit an exam on the first date and then re-sit it on the second date in case of failure (unless formally prohibited by the responsible Professor), or during the following sessions, including the remedial exam session in September. Exception: for trimesters, exams failed in the first trimester cannot be re-sit in April.

Transcript issuance

Unipd will send the Final Transcript of Records (list of all the passed study activities and of their respective grades) directly to an email address of the student's Home University.

Students will have to request the ToR online only after all the exams are registered in the online "booklet" in the Uniweb student portal. Failed exams are not registered in the online booklet; therefore, they will not be reported in the ToR.

Visa and residence permit

Non-EU students residing in non-EU countries must apply for a visa before arriving in Italy. Non-EU students residing in EU countries might not need to apply for a visa, if they hold a valid Residence Permit issued by a EU country.

Health Insurance

EU, EEC (Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein) and Swiss students must bring their [EHIC - European Health Insurance Card](#)

Non-EU students residing in a EU country may use the [EHIC](#) if it is valid abroad.

Non-EU students residing outside the EU, must purchase private health insurance.

Students from the UK can use their [GHIC – Global Health Insurance Card](#) or purchase private health insurance.

Health insurances/cards for non-EU students must meet the following requirements:

- validity for the whole duration of the stay,
- medical coverage of at least Euro 30.000,
- coverage of emergency medical evacuation and repatriation of remains.
- to provide an agency or an emergency contact based in Italy.

Cost of living

Average living costs: €800-€900/month

(including grocery shopping + accommodation and bills + personal extras)

– Accommodation:

Single room: from euro 400 to euro 600 + utilities

Double room: from euro 250 to euro 400 + utilities

– Canteen: €4,60 - €5,70/meal

– Grocery shopping: around €70/week

– Residence permit: around €100/one time [Find out more here!](#)

Italian language course

The University Language Centre (CLA) offers a free course to all exchange students during the mobility period. While a certificate of participation is issued to those attending at least 70% of the lessons, students must pass a final exam, called TAL, to be awarded **3 ECTS credits**.

SAOS

Welcome Service for Foreign Guests

This desk of the International Relations Division assists extra-EU students on immigration-related procedures upon their arrival.

SASSA

The SASSA Service desk from ESU (Regional Agency for the Right to Study) manages the accommodation in the student residence halls and the canteens.

Buddy Service

Students can request a tutor “Buddy” by filling in the relevant section of the Application form in Mobility Online platform.

The Buddy (a University student) will welcome and support exchange students during their stay. Buddies will contact students using their institutional email account @studenti.unipd.it a few weeks before the start of the semester activities.

Psychological assistance
