# 2 Nomination and Application

### **Nominations:**

Partner Universities should send students' official nominations by e-mail to: <u>mobility.in@unipd.it</u>

Nomination deadlines\*:

Autumn/Winter Terms and Full Year – from 15th March to 30th April Spring Terms – from 1st September to 15th October

\*Should a partner not be able to send the nominations before the deadline, they should inform Unipd in advance: <u>mobility.in@unipd.it</u>

### **Applications:**

All the required documents should be sent though the online Application form only. Students should send by email only supplementary/missing documents not available at the time of filling the online form.

Application instructions will be e-mailed to all nominated students.

**Application deadlines:** Autumn/Winter Terms and Full Year – from 15th April to 15th June Spring Terms – from 1st October to 15th November

### Required documents\*

- Passport/ID card
- Passport style and format photo
- Previous study diplomas and Transcript of records (University level)
- Previous study diplomas (Secondary education level/High School)
- Health and travel insurance (if already owned)
- European residence permit or visa (*if any*)

We accept diplomas and transcripts in: Italian, English, Spanish, French and Portuguese

\*To be submitted through the online Application form and anyway before starting the mobility period.

### **Residence Halls**

Although double and joint degree students' requests for on-campus accommodation are prioritised, non-European students' requests will be favoured (in consideration of the visa requirements about accommodation).

Given the very limited number of rooms available in the dorms, we advise European students to look for private accommodation and to start looking at least 6 months in advance (Padua has a large student population: finding accommodation may be very difficult). Therefore we warmly recommend that students invited to request a place in the dorms take advantage of this opportunity, keeping in mind that the number of rooms is in any case very limited.

### Housing contracts duration

The accommodation offers sent by SASSA Service will report standard dates of start/end, which correspond to the duration of the semesters. Students can always ask for customised start/end dates if their stay differs <u>considerably</u> from the standard dates. Students may have to arrange an alternative accommodation if they arrive earlier than their place is available.

### **Private housing**

As an alternative to on-campus accommodation, students can search for private rooms/apartments on *HousingAnywhere*, an international housing platform through which they can book a room/apartment offered by verified private landlords and by outgoing students.

#### **Semester System**

First (winter) Semester\* Classes, 22nd September 2025 – 17th January 2026 Exams, 19th January – 21st February 2026

Second (spring) semester Classes, 23rd February – 13th June 2026 Exams, 15th June – 18th July 2026

\*Exceptions: in the 1st semester most classes start on 29/09/2025. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester the Bachelor's degrees in Dietetics and Nursing may start on 02/02/2026. Please check the timetable for each course unit.

### **Trimester System**

First (fall) Trimester Classes, 22nd September – 29th November 2025 Exams, 1st December – 23rd December 2025

Second (winter) Trimester Classes, 7th January – 14th March 2026 Exams, 16th March – 3rd April 2026

Third (spring) Trimester Classes, 7th April – 13th June 2026 Exams, 15th June – 18th July 2026

# **Credit and grading**

Unipd uses the ECTS credit transfer system. The grades for each exam successfully passed can range from 18 to 30. In case of exceptional performance, the grade is 30 cum laude. In some courses, the grade can be expressed instead as "fail", "sufficient", "satisfactory", "good", "very good" or "excellent". For other courses and activities, such as the Italian Language Laboratory for exchange students (3 ECTS), the positive assessment is not expressed in terms of a grade but simply as "Pass".

### Standard course load

30 ECTS is the standard full-time semester load for degree seeking students. 1 ECTS credit equals 25 hours of study,

including contact hours and self-study.

### **Course registration**

Students do not need to formally enroll in course units.

Two online platforms are used for course and exam registration:

-"Moodle" teaching platforms: to access online teaching, updated info and teaching material,

it is required to register in each course unit before classes start.

-"Uniweb" student portal: students must fill out a study plan here, which will allow them to sign up for exams at the end of the classes. The course coordinator will tell students when they can fill out the study plan.

### Timetable

The start and end dates mentioned in the course catalogue are the general term dates. You can check the real start date of your classes on the <u>timetable portal</u> (fully updated a few weeks before the start of the courses).

### **Examinations**

Each exam session usually offers 2 exam dates for each course. It is possible to sit an exam on the first date and then re-sit it on the second date in case of failure (unless formally prohibited by the responsible Professor), or during the following sessions, including the remedial exam session in September. Exception: for trimesters, exams failed in the first trimester cannot be re-sit in April.

# Visa and residence permit

Non-EU students residing in non-EU countries must apply for a visa before arriving in Italy. <u>Exception</u>: if you have a valid EU permit you can stay in Italy for up to 360 days.

# **Health Insurance**

**EU students** can use the <u>EHIC - European</u> <u>Health Insurance Card</u> for emergency healthcare.

Health insurances/cards for **non-EU students** must be valid for the whole duration of the stay. For private insurance, the insurance company must guarantee a medical coverage of at least Euro 30.000 and coverage of emergency medical evacuation and repatriation of remains. It must also have an <u>agency or an emergency contact</u> <u>based in Italy</u>.

The detailed minimum requirements must be checked with the Italian embassy of reference, since they may vary depending on the embassy.

Students don't need to provide the insurance at the time of completing the Application form, they can send it later by email to mobility.in@unipd.it.

# Cost of living

- Average living costs: € 800-900/month (including grocery shopping + accommodation and bills + personal extras)
- Accommodation in a dorm: € 290 €420/month
- Private accommodation: €400- €600/month
- Canteen: € 4,60 € 5,70/meal
- Grocery shopping: around € 70/week
- Residence permit: around € 100/one time

### Italian language course

Students may attend either an intensive Italian language course before the start of the semester (Communicative course) or a biannual course during the semester.

Only the first course attended will be free of charge.

The Communicative course does not award any ECTS credits. The Biannual course awards 3 ECTS.

### SASSA

The SASSA Service desk from ESU (Regional Agency for the Right to Study) manages the accommodation in the student residence halls and the canteens.

### **Buddy Service**

All non EU students will be assigned a tutor "Buddy" student (i.e. a senior University student) before their arrival in Padua. EU students will be able to request a Buddy. The Buddy will welcome and support exchange students during their stay.

Buddies will contact students using their institutional e-mail account *@studenti.unipd.it* before the start of the semester activities.

# Students with disabilities or learning difficulties

The Student Services Office organises specific initiatives for students with disabilities who wish to participate in an exchange programme.
