Activities concern the promotion of LUMSA as well as the enhancement of the internationalisation and positioning of LUMSA in European and international

contexts. Since 2013 he has been an expert and Vice Chair, on behalf of the European Commission, within the evaluation exercise of the Marie Sklodowska Curie Actions, both in FP7 and in Horizon 2020 (Actions Individual Fellowships, Innovative Training Networks, Researchers' Night). He has previously worked as Head of the International Relations Office at Milan State University and as Multicultural Attachè at the Royal Danish Embassy in Rome were he assisted the Permanent Representative of Denmark at the United Nation's Agencies (FAO, WFP and IFAD) based in Rome.
