Requirements & opportunities



## **Relevant procedures after enrollment**

- Visa application
- Request for the tax code
- Health insurance (through voluntary registration in the National Health Service or private insurance)
- Residence permit application
- Registration as para-subordinate workers for the separate pension scheme + INPS form
- Opening a bank account (+ bank details in Uniweb)





## **Admission qualification**

- EU: D+DS/CIMEA statements\*
- Extra EU: D+ToR + DoV/CIMEA statements\*
- by 12 months from the commencement of the PhD programme
- must meet the eligibility criteria set by the call for admission

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#### Academic English courses for PhD students

#### To attend a course it is required to take the **entry test** to assess the language level



INTRO TO ACADEMIC ENGLISH (30 academic hours course) - Level: B1 - Basic structures of Academic English: nominalization, recognizing sentence structure e.g. the use of noun phrases, recognising tense usage and appropriacy of lexis and register. Argumentation. Focus on pronunciation and conversation in certain contexts (confidence building). Promotion of passive skills to develop understanding and lexis. Addressing typical issues in language and pronunciation which may impede comprehension.

ACADEMIC ENGLISH (30 academic hours course) - Level: from B1+ to B2 or higher. The courses are divided into upper and lower groups. The same topics are covered in different ways and at different speeds according to the level. WRITING: writing emails to academic peers; introduction to writing abstracts, structuring research papers, describing data e.g. from graphs or tables; rhetorical moves, coherence and cohesion, stance. SPEAKING: presenting research papers at seminars/conferences, dealing with questions and strategies for interrupting politely, active listening and turn taking.

MINI COURSES on specific topics (10 hour mini courses) - Level: from B1+ to B2 or higher. The same topics are covered in different ways and at different speeds according to the level.

- ACADEMIC WRITING/ABSTRACT: Conference abstracts and research article abstracts (exploring the differences between conference and research article abstracts, analysis of structure and language use).
- ACADEMIC SPEAKING/PRESENTATION: Aspects of formal/professional vs. informal/friendly language; language for debate and discussion, interaction between the presenter and audience, dealing with questions appropriately; organization of the presentation, signposting language; typical pronunciation issues e.g. key vowel sounds; each student will have the opportunity to give a presentation with the aim of improving their delivery and pronunciation as well as building confidence.

### Cotutelle de thèse

A cotutelle, so called since the program originated in France, is a Ph.D. conducted in the framework of a **bilateral agreement** signed between two universities of two different Countries

Such agreement regulates:

• enrollment  $\rightarrow$  admission, tuition fees, duration of the programme



- research work → thesis topic, supervisors, language of thesis and defense, grants, mobility scheduling
- thesis evaluation → thesis assessment, board of examiners, final examination, degree awarded

The conduct of the research and its contents, the use of materials as well as intellectual property rights, confidentiality and privacy are agreed on separately as necessary



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This collaboration implies:

- simultaneous enrollment at both partner universities
- alternate periods of mobility at the two institutions (preferably of equivalent duration, minimum six months)
- two supervisors, one for each university
- a single final exam (viva voce) before a committee composed of members from both partner universities, recognized by both institutions
- the awarding of a double or joint degree





#### **Requirements and procedure**

For each cotutelle procedure, an **individual agreement** must be concluded between the participating universities and the doctoral candidate.

The University Guidelines for the establishment of cotutelle agreements detail:

- deadlines for the submission of the application -> within 15/18 months from the start of the programme

- documentation to be attached to the request  $\rightarrow$  application form + acceptance letter from the two supervisors

- minimum content of the agreement
- reporting duties of co-supervised PhD students
- The official approval must be requested to the Academic Board of the programme



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So far, Unipd has made cotutelle agreements with 215 universities from 34 different Countries:





### Pros & cons

yes	but
it increases the level of <b>internationalization</b> of the research work and of the universities involved	economic issues: possible <b>tuition fees</b> + living costs
it encourages <b>mobility</b> abroad, which can be extra funded	high level of <b>stress</b> to meet requirements and deadlines of two institutions
it allows you to experience the reality of two different academic systems, increase your <b>linguistic and intercultural skills</b> , gain new research competencies	it's a very <b>long process</b> + negotiation may fail. The agreement may not go through, because of incompatible rules
