

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Enrolment is open for the first year of open-access Master's Degree Programmes with requirements for the Scuola di Economia e Scienze Politiche¹ indicated in the table below, for the academic year 2025/26.

It is possible apply for recognition of credits already acquired in previous university careers to access the course with a career shortening. Information on this can be found in point 6 of this call.

1.2 Admission requirements

¹ The activation of the first year of the degree programmes is subject to their accreditation in accordance with the provisions of Ministerial Decree 1154/2021 "Self-assessment, evaluation, initial and periodic accreditation of locations and courses of study" and to the achievement of a minimum number of preenrolments; therefore, if the course is not accredited or if the number of pre-enrolment applications submitted is less than 15 (5 for each curriculum), the Course will not be activated. All information relating to the activation of the course is published on the internet address http://www.unipd.it. The minimum number indicated does not apply to newly established, professionalizing and inter-university degree programmes.

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Deadlines

To be admitted to the aforesaid degree programmes, candidates ² must:

- 1. Have obtained a Bachelor's degree (Bachelor's degree, single-cycle master's degree, university diploma or equivalent) in Italy and recognized as suitable according to current legislation. The degree must have been obtained by 30 January 2026. Those who access using a qualification obtained abroad must follow the deadlines and procedures shown on the page https://www.unipd.it/en/how-apply.
- 2. be in possession of the **minimum curricular requirements** and **personal preparation** required for each course as reported in Annex 1.
- 3. **pre-enrol** following the procedures and deadlines set out in point 2;
- 4. submit the application for **assessment of the minimum curricular requirements** following the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3;
- 5. pass the **admission test** relating to the chosen Course(s) (points 4.2, 4.3, 4.4) or obtain **exemption** (point 4.1);
- 6. submit an application for **enrolment**, **change of course or incoming transfer following** the procedures and deadlines set out in point 5.

2. REGISTRATION AND PRE-ENROLMENT ON THE UNIWEB PORTAL

The pre-enrolment application is completed by accessing the www.uniweb.unipd.it portal

From 12 noon on 4 June 2025 to 12 noon on 7 July 2025

2.1 Registration on the Uniweb portal

If you are logging into Uniweb for the first time, you must create a new user account at www.uniweb.unipd.it by clicking $Menu \rightarrow Registration$.

At the end of the registration process, candidates will receive an email with a username and an activation code to log in to <u>uniweb.unipd.it/password/index.php/it/utenti/identifica/azione/a</u>, where they will be asked to set up three security questions and a password. With the username obtained and the password set, candidates can log in to their personal area.

Students can also register with the $\underline{www.uniweb.unipd.it}$ portal using SPID credentials by clicking on $Menu \rightarrow Registration \ with \ SPID$.

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Deadlines

2.2 Pre-enrolment

To pre-enrol you must:

- log in with your credentials to www.uniweb.unipd.it, click on the items Home → Evaluation test →
 Pre-enrolment for unlimited places → Master's Degree Course and indicate the course of interest
 (point 1.1). At this stage it is possible to request a personalized test (point 4.4);
- 2. enter the degree qualification to be used for access to the course, if not already present in the system.
 - **Students of the University of Padua** who are about to graduate can complete pre-enrolment only after submitting the online application for the degree. In the event that this application has not yet been submitted, in order to proceed, you will need to make your situation known to immatricolazioni.studenti@unipd.it;
- 3. at the same time, pay the pre-enrolment fee of € 30.00 generated in your Uniweb reserved area in the section for the contribution through the PagoPA procedure (instructions on page https://www.unipd.it/en/studying-padua/funding-and-fees/key-documents/pagopa).

It is possible to apply for pre-enrolment **for one or more of the degree programmes** indicated in this call. For each pre-enrolment the instructions in the three above points must be followed separately, submitting the relevant application to have the curricular requirements assessed (<u>point</u> 3.1) and participate in the relevant admission test or interview, unless **exempted** (<u>point</u> 4).

3. KNOWLEDGE REQUIRED FOR ACCESS

3.1 Procedure and deadlines

To access the chosen degree programme, it is necessary to be in possession of specific minimum curricular requirements and adequate personal preparation.

In order to demonstrate the possession of the minimum curricular requirements required by each degree programme (indicated in <u>Annex 1</u>) and for the calculation of the weighted average, valid for exemption from the admission test (<u>point 4.1</u>), candidates must complete a specific online procedure in which they will be asked to state the training activities performed during the course of their academic career.

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Deadlines

N.B.: the training activities and declared exams for admission to the Degree Programme must have been **taken and recorded** at the **time of submitting** the application for the assessment; exams taken or recorded subsequently cannot be declared and will not be considered for admission purposes.

The **application for** assessment of requirements must be completed online **after** completing preenrolment (point 2) and can be submitted

From 12 noon on 4 June 2025 to 12 noon on 7 July 2025

Anyone intending to apply for admission to more than one Degree Programme must submit an application for the assessment of the minimum curricular requirements (and the related preenrolment) for each of the degree programmes they are interested in.

3.2 Publication of evaluation results

The results of the application for assessment of the requirements are published on **15 July 2025** on pages www.unipd.it/ammissioni-esp-magistrali-fanno and www.economia.unipd.it.

This publication also indicates the need to take the admission tests or any exemptions awarded (point 4.1).

4. ASSESSING THE PERSONAL PREPARATION: ADMISSION TESTS AND INTERVIEWS

4.1 Exemption from admission tests or interviews

University examinations taken and registered by **the deadline for the minimum curricular requirement application**, are taken into consideration for assessing an exemption or the need to take the admission test or interview (point 3).

Those who have achieved a weighted average **greater than or equal to 25/30** are **exempt from taking the test**. The average is calculated **without rounding** on all the exams taken and recorded within the course of origin and in the additional exams declared in the application for evaluation of the minimum curricular requirements, among the credits accepted for each degree programme in Annex 1 (in particular, in alternative 2).

The list of those who are exempt from taking the admission tests is published on **15 July 2025**, at the same time as the results of the evaluation of the minimum curricular requirements, on pages www.unipd.it/ammissioni-esp-magistrali-fanno and www.economia.unipd.it.

4.2 Non-exempted candidates: date and arrangements for the test or interview

For each course for which you intend to compete, if you meet the curricular requirements but have not achieved the average of 25/30, you must take the relevant test, interview or online test. In order to be admitted to take the test, candidates must therefore:

- be pre-enrolled following the methods and deadlines indicated in point 2;
- have submitted an application for the assessment of the minimum curricular requirements following the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3;
- have obtained the outcome "eligible" result in the evaluation of the minimum curricular requirements and, following the failure to reach the weighted average of 25/30, have been called for the admission tests (point 3.2).

The tests will take place, for each degree programme, on the following dates:

Admission interviews, for the degree programmes in *Applied Economics* and *Management for Sustainable Firms*: 21, 22 and 23 July 2025 (catch-up date, if required: 25 July 2025).

By 17 July 2025, a document will be published at www.economia.unipd.it, specifying:

- the date and time that each candidate has their appointment;
- the procedures for taking the interview and instructions on how to connect to the online meeting to take it.

Online admission test, for the course in *Accounting Finance and Business Consulting*: July 24, 2025.

By 17 July 2025, a document will be published on page www.unipd.it/ammissioni-esp-magistrali-fanno, specifying:

- the time of the online test;
- the devices required and the technical specifications needed to take the test;
- the procedures for and regulation of the conduct of the test..

Any notices and changes concerning the conduct of the test or interviews will be posted on the same page.

4.3 Non-exempted candidates: test structure and publication of results

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Deadlines

Information on the number of expected questions, the time allowed, the topics to be tested, the allocation of marks and the minimum marks for passing the test can be found for each degree programme in Annex 1 of this notice.

The results of the oral tests will be published on **1 August 2025** at the address www.economia.unipd.it, those of the written test on page www.unipd.it/ammissioni-esp-magistralifanno.

4.4 Non-exempt candidates: request for a personalised test for candidates with a disability, impairment, or SLD diagnosis

Candidates with disabilities, impairments, or specific learning disabilities (SLD), pursuant to Article 16 of Legge (Law) no. 104/1992 and Legge (Law) no. 170/2010, may request an admission test with additional time and/or personalised support by making an express request to the Student Services Office – Inclusion Unit. To this end, interested candidates must:

- make a request for a personalised test within the pre-enrolment procedure (point 2.2) in Uniweb, specifying the supports, aids or compensatory measures required. Any additional time assigned may not exceed 50% more (candidates with disabilities) and 30% more (candidates with SLD) than the time scheduled for the test;
- 2. **send an e-mail** to inclusione.studenti@unipd.it attaching the following documents:
 - civil invalidity certificate and/or a certificate pursuant to Law no. 104 of 1992 issued by the competent medical commission for the territory, proving the type of disability (NO OMISSIS) and, where envisaged, the recognised percentage of invalidity;
 - certificate of SLD diagnosis issued no more than 3 years previously, if prior to the candidate's eighteenth birthday, or if subsequent to the candidate's eighteenth birthday, by local public health facilities or by bodies and professionals accredited with the regional health service. Where not already specified, also attach the document proving the code or accreditation number or the conformity of the diagnosis issued by the relevant bodies. In compliance with the provisions of the "Guidelines on Specific Learning Disorders" attached to the Ministerial Decree of 12 July 2011 prot. 5669, candidates with SLD are granted an additional time equal to a maximum of 30% more than that defined for the admission test. Candidates with SLD may request additional time and/or personalized support with the medical certification they hold, even if it has expired. The new documentation, updated for the university cycle of studies, must be sent to inclusione.studenti@unipd.it no later than 30 September

However, personalized educational plans (PDP), SLD diagnoses issued before the last school cycle (upper secondary school) and/or by non-accredited private individuals are not accepted under any circumstances.

valid identity or identification document.

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Candidates with disability, disability or SLD from EU countries and non-EU countries residing abroad who wish to benefit from personalised support, must submit a certificate, which, where provided for under current international rules and regulations, has been legalised, of their disability, invalidity, or SLD condition issued in their country of residence, accompanied by a sworn translation or a translation certified by the Italian diplomatic services as conforming to the original text, in Italian or English. The Student Services Office – Inclusion Unit, in charge of examining these certifications, ascertains that the foreign documentation attests to a condition of disability, disability or SLD recognized by Italian law.

The requested supports and/or aids may be granted after an appropriate assessment has been made by the Student Services Office – Inclusion Unit. No later than the day before the test takes place, candidates will receive a specific communication regarding any support and/or provided, by e-mail sent by the Student Services Office – Inclusion Unit, inclusione.studenti@unipd.it.

In any case, tools such as dictionaries and/or formularies, forms, periodic table of elements, concept maps, computers (other than the one used to carry out the test), tablets, smartphones, smart glasses and other similar tools are not allowed.

5. ENROLMENT, CHANGE OF COURSE, TRANSFER FROM ANOTHER UNIVERSITY

5.1 Requirements and procedures

In order to enrol, change course or transfer from another university, candidates must:

- have pre-enrolled following the procedures and by deadlines indicated in point 2;
- have submitted the application for the assessment of the minimum curricular requirements
 following the procedures and deadlines set out in point 3;
- have obtained an "eligible" result in the assessment of the minimum curricular requirements (point 3.2):
- have passed the admission test (if taken) based on the results published on 1 August 2025 (point 4.2), or have been exempted from taking it (point 4.1);
- have obtained a bachelor's degree or equivalent.
 Graduation from the University of Padua must update their graduation data in the Uniweb reserved area in the Home → Qualifications section.

The application for enrolment must be submitted:

from 3 pm on 1 August to 12 noon on 16 February 2026.

The application for transfer from another university must be submitted

from 3 pm on 1 August to 12 noon on 31 October 2025.

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Deadlines

The application for a change of course must be submitted:

from 3 pm on 2 September to 12 noon on 31 October 2025.

The enrolment procedures in the standard enrolment, course change, transfer from another university or simultaneous enrolment are shown on page www.unipd.it/istruzioniaccesso-triennali-magistrali-ciclounico.

N.B.: failing to comply with the deadlines and terms of the set out procedures and concurrently pay the first instalment will constitute a waiver of the entry to the chosen Master's Degree Programme.

Those who have missed a deadline but are interested in the course can submit an application for extraordinary enrolment which is evaluated after the enrolment deadlines. Instructions and conditions are available on page www.unipd.it/istruzioniaccesso-triennali-magistrali-ciclounico.

The enrolment procedures for the course are effective only after completion by the Student Office - Enrolment and Admission Testing Unit; the operation is communicated by sending an email to the e-mail address registered on the Uniweb portal.

6. RECOGNITION OF PREVIOUS CREDITS AND CAREER SHORTENING

It is possible to request the recognition of training activities and exams coming from master's degree courses taken (including abroad), such as single courses or in previous university careers, so as not to have to take them again in the course of study.

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Deadlines

To access the courses by career shortening, it is still necessary to meet the requirements and complete all the procedures indicated in <u>point 1.2</u>, without any difference from those who do not apply for the recognition of previous credits.

The university educational credits necessary to achieve the minimum curricular requirements, or those included in the qualification used for admission to the degree programme, **will not be taken into consideration** for shortening the university career.

For this purpose, only exams belonging to master's degree courses or equivalent levels are taken into consideration, as assessed by the commission in charge.

The instructions for submitting the application for credit recognition (deadlines and procedures) are published starting from 4 June 2025 on page www.unipd.it/ammissioni-esp-magistrali-fanno.

The teaching committee in charge issues a resolution for the recognition of credits containing the list of training activities/credits recognized and the proposed year of admission, which is established with the following criterion:

- recognition less than or equal to 40 CFU → 1st year;
- recognition greater than or equal to 41 CFU → 2nd year.

For the purposes of enrolment in the second year, it is necessary to have already obtained the credits relating to activities similar to the English language proficiency or the Italian language proficiency, limited to the two Master's Degree Courses in vehicular language Applied Economics and Management for Sustainable Firms. In the absence of the compulsory language proficiency, regardless of the possession of a number of recognized credits greater than or equal to 41, admission to the first year is proposed.

After obtaining eligibility for the curricular requirements (and passing the relevant admission test, if not exempted as indicated in <u>point 4</u>), it is possible to proceed with enrolment, course change or transfer or simultaneous enrolment as indicated on page <u>www.unipd.it/istruzioniaccesso-triennalimagistrali-ciclounico</u>.

The inclusion of validations/recognitions in the online booklet and any update of the course year (for those who obtain the admission proposed to the second year in the credit recognition resolution) is carried out by the reference Back Office within the first exam session scheduled for the academic year 2025/26, without the need for further procedures or requests.

WARNINGS

- 1. Pursuant to Article 4 of Italian Law 241 of 7 August 1990 (New rules on administrative procedures and right of access to administrative documents) and subsequent amendments, the Programme Coordinator or the Assessment Committee shall be appointed as the person/body responsible for the administrative procedure on admissions.

- 3. Current legislation on statements: if the documentation submitted by the candidate contains false or untrue statements, without prejudice to the penalties provided for by the Italian Criminal Code and the special laws on the matter (Articles 75 and 76 of Presidential Decree No. 445/2000), the candidate's enrolment shall automatically cease. The University will recover any benefits granted (e.g. scholarships) and will not reimburse for the fees paid. Finally, whoever makes a false statement will be liable to an action for damages by the interested parties.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT (ALL COURSES)

For all the courses in this notice, a knowledge of the English language of a level greater than or equal to B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is required.

The language requirement must be met at the same time as the application for evaluation of curricular requirements, by submitting any required documentation (point 3) at that time, through one of the following alternatives:

Possession of a language certification of level B2 or higher. The list of accepted certifications and the score thresholds to refer to are indicated on page www.unipd.it/requisito-inglese-ammissione.

Certificates are accepted only if obtained on or after 1 January 2020.

Alternative 1:

Required documentation

It is necessary to attach the certification, front and back, within the procedure. Those who have taken the test and have not yet received the certificate can present the provisional certificate of the score obtained (statement of results) issued by the certifying body.

Or

Be a native English speaker.

Native speakers are those who are in possession of an identity document indicating one of the following nationalities (dual citizenship is also considered valid in this sense): Antigua and Barbuda, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Canada, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Ireland, Jamaica, Malta, New Zealand, St Kitts and Nevis, St Lucia, St Vincent and the Grenadines, Trinidad and Tobago, United Kingdom, USA.

Alternative 2:

Required documentation

To certify your status as a native speaker, it is necessary to attach an identity document in the appropriate section of the procedure that shows the possession of the citizenship in question.

Or

Possession of a qualification/degree of a course entirely taught in English.

The qualifications accepted are those relating to a bachelor's degree, single-cycle master's degree, master's degree, or equivalent (foreign qualifications or previous systems); it is not enough to have completed part of the course abroad.

Required documentation

The achievement of the degree must be demonstrated by attaching the self-certification with exams or the diploma supplement provided by the university where it was obtained.

Alternative 3:

If the qualification in question (<u>presented for the sole purpose of passing the language requirement</u>) was obtained abroad, the Transcript of Records and the final diploma of achievement are required.

In any case, the document must explicitly indicate the language in which the degree programme has been delivered, otherwise it is necessary to attach an official document issued by the university certifying the language of delivery of the course.

Alternative 4:

Have acquired a minimum of 30 credits from courses taught in English as part of a Bachelor's Degree, Single-Cycle Master's Degree, Master's Degree or individual courses. Only ECTS credits obtained or recognized in courses of study provided by Italian universities are taken into consideration (e.g. exams delivered in English obtained during the Erasmus programme and recognized within the Italian university career are considered valid).

Required documentation

Passing the exams must be demonstrated by attaching the self-certification with exams issued by the Italian university where the exams were taken or recognized.

Or

Possession of an **open badge** issued by an **Italian university** or a certificate from a **Language Centre of an Italian university**.

Open badge and certificates are accepted only if obtained on or after 1 January 2020.

Required documentation

The certificate or open badge must be attached in the appropriate section of the procedure. It is specified that:

 the language certificate must be drawn up on the letterhead of the university that issued it, must contain the student's personal details and must clearly state that they have passed a B2 level test or higher (compared to what is required by each course of study):

Alternative 5:

Alternatively, within the procedure, it is possible to self-declare that you have passed the test administered by the language center (Centro linguistico di ateneo) for the required level of English. You must upload a file containing your personal details, the date you passed the test, the name of the language center where the test was taken and the contact details of the language center or of the office that manages the administration of the test (email address and telephone number) for the necessary checks on what you have declared.

 the open badge must contain the student's personal details and must show the level of the exam, B2 or higher (compared to what is required by <u>each course of study</u>); You can attach the pdf of the Open Badge or a document that shows the link (URL) in which it can be consulted.

Passing the **TAL B2 reading and listening** test provided by **the CLA** (University Language Centre) of the University of Padua
