1. GENERAL INFORMATION

This announcement puts out to tender the positions left vacant following the selection held in the months of March - April - May.

This call is intended for **Italian, European Union or equivalent**¹ **candidates**. This category includes:

- citizens of any member state of the European Union;
- citizens of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland, Republic of San Marino;
- citizens with dual citizenship, one of whom is Italian/European;
- citizens of a country outside the European Union, residing in Italy and in possession of a valid residence permit that allows enrolment at the University, according to the current legislation on enrolment: https://www.unipd.it/soggiorni-superiori-90-giorni-studenti
- candidates in possession of an Italian access qualification, regardless of their citizenship.

1.2 Admission requirements

To be admitted to the first year of the programme, candidates must:

- 1. obtain a three-year degree in Italy or an equivalent foreign qualification² by 30 September 2025³, with a minimum grade greater than or equal to **99/110**. In addition, it is necessary that the qualification and one's university career meet at least 1 of the following two conditions:
 - the qualification must belong to one of the following classes: Education and Training Sciences (L-19), Communication Sciences (L-20), Psychological Sciences and Techniques (L-24), Political Sciences and International Relations (L-36), Sociology (L-40) (DM 270/2004), or in the case of a foreign qualification, which is a qualification comparable in content to these classes:
 - Alternatively, it is possible to apply with a qualification belonging to a different class and a minimum of 18 credits of exams in the SSDs: SPS/01,02,04,07,08,09,10,11,12 and a minimum of 6 credits of exams in the SSDs: SECS-S/01,05 and M-PSI/03. For candidates with a foreign access qualification, the qualification must include at least 10% of credits obtained in exams related to the area of Political and Social Sciences (Political Philosophy, History of Political Doctrines, Political Science, General Sociology, Cultural and Communicative Processes, Economic and Labour Processes, Environment and Territory, Political Phenomena, Legal sociology of deviance and social change); and at least one exam in Statistics, Social Statistics or Psychometrics;
- 2. demonstrate that they have a level of knowledge of the English language at least level **B2** (CEFR) by submitting a certification **by 30 September 2025**, excluding cases of exemption provided for. The list of accepted certifications, the relative minimum scores required and exemptions is available in Annex 1.
- 3. **Participate in the selection** process by following the procedures and deadlines indicated in <u>point</u> <u>2</u>;
- 4. **Be admitted**: the ranking, any assignments and repechages are published on the dates and pages indicated in <u>point 2</u>;
- 5. **Enrolment**: admitted candidates must submit an application for enrolment, change of course or transfer from another university within the peremptory deadlines indicated in <u>point 2</u>.

1.3 Criteria for drawing up the admission rankings

The admission rankings are determined in order of score on the basis of the following criteria:

- candidates in possession of a degree belonging to classes L-19, L-20, L-24, L-36, L-40 (DM 270/2004), obtained by the close of pre-enrolment for access to the selection: the degree grade is taken into consideration:
- candidates in possession of a degree belonging to classes L-19, L-20, L-24, L-36, L-40 (DM 270/2004), obtained after the closing of pre-enrolment for access to the selection: the arithmetic average of the exams in the degree being obtained, taken and recorded by the close of pre-enrolment, is taken into consideration;
- candidates in possession of a degree belonging to classes other than those referred to in the previous point: the arithmetic average of the exams in the SSDs referred to in the previous point, taken and recorded by the closing date of pre-enrolment, is taken into consideration. In the event of possession of a number of useful credits greater than 24, for the purposes of the calculation, the exams with the highest grade up to the established limit are taken into consideration.

Only the credits indicated in the academic documentation sent during the pre-enrolment phase and assessment of curricular requirements are considered.

The final ranking is drawn up in order of score on a basis of 100 by normalizing the degree grades and arithmetic averages as described for the three cases proposed.

In the event of a tie, priority is given to the youngest candidate.

For candidates with a qualification obtained abroad with training courses that cannot be assessed according to the criteria indicated above, the verification of the required knowledge will be carried out by the commission on the basis of the candidate's educational path in line with curricular requirements and the personal preparation required for access to the course.

Please note: failure to obtain the degree and its update on the Uniweb portal by 30 September 2025 will result in the forfeiture of the admission ranking.

2. SELECTION: DEADLINES AND DEADLINES TO BE MET

To participate in the selection and access the course of interest, it is necessary to:

- 1. pre-enrol (point 3) in the period 15 July 2025 (12:00 noon) 28 August 2025 (12:00 noon) by paying the €30 fee in your reserved area on the www.uniweb.unipd.it portal;
- 2. submit the application for **evaluation of curricular requirements** in the period **15 July 2025** (3:00 pm) **28 August 2025** (3:00 pm) (point 4). The exams and educational activities included in the application are used to draw up the ranking;
- 3. **Be admitted**: the rankings are drawn up as indicated in point <u>1.3</u>; these, and subsequent reassignments, are published on the dates and pages indicated in the table below. The publications have the value of official communication to interested parties;

4. **Enrolment:** the application for enrolment, change of course or transfer from another university must be submitted within the deadlines indicated in the table below, depending on the time at which you are admitted to the ranking list. The procedures to be followed are indicated in point 5.

EU or equivalent candidates with a foreign access qualification can participate in this selection by following the procedures indicated in <u>point 6</u>.

Reassignments and scrolling of the ranking list: if there are additional places available for access to the course after 13 October, candidates who are admitted to the ranking list following the scrolling will receive the necessary instructions for enrolment by email, including the deadlines to be met to accept the place obtained in the course.

Please note: failure to comply with the deadlines and terms of the procedures indicated and the simultaneous payment of the first instalment is equivalent to renunciation of the place, which will be put back up to competition in subsequent reassignments.

Candidates who, at the time of assignment of the place in the ranking list, are not yet in possession of the **language certification** or **the access qualification**, can accept the place won with reservations, with the obligation to update the data on the achievement of the access qualification and to submit the language certification **by 30 September 2025**. The procedures for updating the qualification and submitting the certification are communicated at the same time as the publication of the ranking list.

3. REGISTRATION AND PRE-ENROLMENT ON THE UNIWEB PORTAL

The pre-enrolment application is completed by accessing the www.uniweb.unipd.it portal

on the dates provided for by the selection (point 2).

3.1 Registration on the Uniweb portal

If you are accessing Uniweb for the first time, you must create a new account by clicking on www.uniweb.unipd.it and on $Menu \rightarrow Registration$.

At the end of the registration, you will receive an e-mail username and activation code with which to access the <u>uniweb.unipd.it/password/index.php/it/utenti/identifica/azione/a</u> page, where you will be asked to set three security questions and a password. With the username obtained and the password set, you can access your reserved area.

Registration on the <u>www.uniweb.unipd.it</u> portal can also be done using SPID credentials, by clicking on the *Menu* \rightarrow *items Registration with SPID*.

3.2 Submitting the pre-enrolment application

To pre-enrol you must:

- 1. log in with your credentials to www.uniweb.unipd.it, click on the items Didactics → Pre-enrolment with limited access → Course Type "Master's Degree Course" and indicate the course of interest (point 1.1).
- 2. enter the degree to be used for access to the course, if not already present in the system. Students enrolled at the University of Padua who are about to graduate can complete preenrolment only after submitting the online application for the degree. In the event that this application has not yet been submitted, in order to proceed, it is necessary to report your situation to immatricolazioni.studenti@unipd.it;
- 3. at the same time, pay the pre-enrolment fee of € 30.00 through the PagoPA procedure (instructions on page www.unipd.it/pago-pa).

4. EVALUATION OF CURRICULAR REQUIREMENTS

4.1 Procedure and deadlines

The evaluation procedure of the above point is available online only after completing the preenrolment (point 3):

on the dates provided for by the selection (point 2.1).

Depending on the type of title you use to log in, you must proceed as indicated in the following points.

4.1.1 Qualifications obtained in Italy

Degrees from legal systems subsequent to 1999 – DM 509/99 or DM 270/04 (Bachelor's degree or single-cycle master's degree)

The application for evaluation of the minimum curricular requirements must be submitted online on the www.uniweb.unipd.it/valutazionetitoli_portal, logging in with Uniweb **credentials**. Detailed instructions for submitting the application are available on the page.

4.1.2 Qualifications obtained abroad

It should be noted that it is also necessary to submit the **pre-enrolment application on the Uniweb portal** (point 3);

4.2 Eligibility Outcome

Eligibility for the verification of the minimum curricular requirements (CFU and SSD sectors) is awarded in time for the publication of the rankings.

The self-declared language requirement is initially considered to be automatically met by the system; checks are carried out on the declarations made and on the certifications uploaded after the submission of the application.

In the case of untruthful declarations or uploaded certifications that do not comply with the indications of Annex 2, the candidate is declared unsuitable and is forfeited from the admission ranking.

Candidates who have not obtained the admission qualification or language certification by 28 August (the closing date of the procedure) but who intend to obtain it by 30 September are assessed as "suitable with reservations"

5. ENROLMENT, CHANGE OF COURSE, TRANSFER FROM ANOTHER UNIVERSITY

5.1 Procedures

In order to enrol, change courses or transfer from another university, it is necessary to:

- have submitted the pre-enrolment application (point 3);
- have submitted the application for assessment of the requirements (point 4) and be in possession of the required requirements;
- be "admitted" in the ranking;
- have registered the data on the achievement of the admission qualification by 30 September 2025. Registration takes place automatically for students who obtain the admission qualification at the University of Padua, while it must be completed manually for graduates from other universities in the Uniweb reserved area in the Teaching → Qualifications section.

Deadlines

The application for enrolment, change of course or transfer from another university must be submitted

on the dates scheduled for each assignment (point 2).

Please note: failure to comply with the deadlines and terms of the procedures indicated and the simultaneous payment of the first instalment is equivalent to renunciation of access to the chosen Master's Degree Programme.

Those who have missed a deadline but are interested in the course can submit an application for extraordinary enrolment which is evaluated at the end of the enrolment of the last scheduled selection. Failure to submit documentation, incomplete documentation or an unsuitable qualification do not allow the completion of enrolment by the offices.

In order to ensure a smooth start to teaching, all international students must be regularly enrolled with all the necessary documents by **31 October 2025**.

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7. PERSON IN CHARGE OF THE PROCEDURE, PERSONAL DATA, NOTES AND

WARNINGS

- Pursuant to art. 4 of Law 241 of 7 August 1990 (New rules on administrative procedure and right of access to administrative documents) and subsequent amendments, the President of the Course of Study or the Commission in charge of evaluation is appointed as the person responsible for the administrative access procedure.
- 2. Responsible for the Access to Records Procedure: Director of the Student Careers Office, Dr. Maria Chiara Ferraresi.
- 3. Current legislation on declarations: in the event that the documentation submitted by the candidate shows false or misleading declarations, without prejudice to the sanctions provided for by the Criminal Code and the special laws on the subject (Articles 75 and 76 of Presidential Decree 445/2000), the candidate automatically loses his/her enrolment. ANNEX 1 – Recognition of credits for career shortening

It is possible to request the recognition of activities and exams taken (including abroad), such as single courses or in previous university careers, so that you do not have to take them again in the course of study. To apply for recognition, you must:

- submit the pre-enrolment application (point 3);
- submit the application for evaluation of the minimum curricular requirements (point 4). A special section is <u>available on the</u> www.uniweb.unipd.it/valutazionetitoli portal to submit the application for recognition of credits for career shortening; candidates with a foreign access qualification or belonging to an old system can refer to the contacts referred to in point 4 for information on this matter.

The commission in charge evaluates the application submitted and issues a resolution indicating the exams/activities recognized.

For more information on how to recognize training activities, as well as for any clarifications on the resolution received, you can contact the Back office of your course of study: www.unipd.it/backoffice-carriere-studenti – scienzeumane.studenti@unipd.it.

The admission requirements to be met remain the same as those indicated in this call for admission (point 1.2), without any kind of difference from those who enter the first year without having obtained the recognition of credits. Recognized credits are automatically uploaded to your booklet after completion of enrolment and within the first exam session available for the academic year 2025/26.

ANNEX 2 – Language requirement

To be admitted to the course, it is necessary to have and demonstrate a knowledge of the English language of level equal to or higher than B2 (CEFR).

The language requirement must be met by 30 September 2025.

Candidates who access with a foreign access qualification must meet the requirement in the manner indicated on page www.unipd.it/requisito-linguistico-ammissione-corsi-studio-ateneo.

Candidates with **an Italian admission qualification** must meet the requirement through one of the following alternative methods:

Possession of a **language certification of level B2 or higher**. The list of accepted certifications and the score thresholds to refer to are indicated on page www.unipd.it/requisito-inglese-ammissione.

Certificates obtained on or after 1 January 2020 are accepted.

Alternative 1:

Required documentation

It is necessary to attach the certification, front and back, within the procedure. Those who have taken the test and have not yet received the certificate can present the provisional certificate of the score obtained (statement of results) issued by the certifying body.

Or

Be a native English speaker.

Native speakers are those who are in possession of an identity document indicating one of the following nationalities (dual citizenship is also considered valid in this sense): Antigua and Barbuda, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Canada, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Ireland, Jamaica, Malta, New Zealand, St Kitts and Nevis, St Lucia, St Vincent and the Grenadines, Trinidad and Tobago, United Kingdom, USA.

Alternative 2:

Required documentation

To certify your status as a native speaker, it is necessary to attach an identity document in the appropriate section of the procedure that shows the possession of the citizenship in question.

Or

Possession of a qualification of a course entirely taught in English.

The qualifications accepted are those relating to a bachelor's degree, single-cycle master's degree, master's degree, or equivalent (foreign qualifications or previous systems); it is not enough to have completed part of the course abroad.

Required documentation

The achievement of the degree must be demonstrated by attaching the self-certification with exams or the diploma supplement provided by the university where it was obtained.

Alternative 3:

If the qualification in question (<u>presented for the sole purpose of passing the language requirement</u>) was obtained abroad, the Transcript of Records and the final diploma of achievement are required.

In any case, the document must explicitly indicate the language of delivery of the course. Otherwise, it is necessary to attach an official document issued by the university certifying the language of delivery of the course.

Possession of an **open badge** issued by an **Italian university** or a certificate from a **Language Center of an Italian university**⁶

Required documentation

The certificate or open badge must be attached in the appropriate section of the procedure. It is specified that:

Alternative 4:

- the language certificate must be drawn up on the letterhead of the Language Centre
 of the Italian university that issued it, must contain the student's personal details and
 must clearly indicate that they have passed a B2 level test or higher taken at the same
 University Language Centre (Italian) that issued it;
- the open badge must contain the student's personal details and must show the level of the exam, B2 or higher; You can attach the pdf of the Open Badge or a document that shows the link (URL) in which it can be consulted.

⁶ Any English language exams/qualifications taken during the university career that have not led to the issuance of an open badge are, therefore, **in no case** considered valid.
