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1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Selections are open for admission to the first year of the Master's Degree Programmes with limited access of the Scuola di Psicologia¹ indicated in the table below, for the academic year 2026/27.

The degree programmes are delivered in English.

¹ The activation of the first year of the degree programmes of study is subject to their accreditation in accordance with the provisions of Ministerial Decree 1154/2021 "Self-assessment, evaluation, initial and periodic accreditation of locations and courses of study"; therefore the course will not be activated in the event of non-accreditation. The activation of any curricula is also subject to the achievement of a minimum number of 5 students enrolled for each of them. 1.2 Admission requirements

To be eligible, applicants must:

1. obtain **a three-year degree in Italy or an equivalent foreign qualification** by 31 July 2026², according to current legislation;
2. Be in possession of the **curricular requirements** and **personal preparation** required, as reported for each course in [Annex 2](#);
3. **Participate in the selection** process by following the procedures and deadlines indicated in [point 2](#);
4. **Be admitted**: the ranking, any assignments and repechages are published on the dates and pages provided for by the selection;
5. **Enrol**: admitted candidates must submit an application for enrolment, change of course or transfer from another university within the peremptory deadlines set by the selection.

1.3 Criteria for the formation of the admission ranking list

The rankings are drawn up on the basis of the score obtained in the evaluation of the course of study; details on the formation of the ranking list and the management of parity are specified for each degree programme in [Annex 2](#).

2. SELECTION: DEADLINES AND DEADLINES TO BE MET

To participate in the selection and access the degree programme of interest, it is necessary to:

1. **pre-enrol** ([point 3](#)) in the period **10 March – 10 April 2026** (full day);
2. submit the application for **evaluation of curricular requirements** in the period **10 March – 10 April 2026** (full day) ([point 4](#));
3. **submit the required language documentation** ([Annex 3](#)) **by 31 July 2026**;
4. **be admitted**: the rankings are drawn up as indicated for each degree programme in [Annex 2](#), and published on the dates and pages indicated in the table below. The publication has the value of official communication to interested parties;

Candidates who, at the time of the assignment of the place in the ranking list, do not yet meet the **language requirement** and/or who have not yet obtained the **entry title** are **provisionally admitted**.

Both of these requirements must be met **by July 31, 2026**.

3. REGISTRATION AND PRE-ENROLMENT ON THE UNIWEB PORTAL

The pre-enrolment application is completed by accessing the www.uniweb.unipd.it portal

on the dates indicated for the selection ([point 2](#)).

3.1 Registration on the Uniweb portal

If you are accessing Uniweb for the first time, you must create a new account by clicking on www.uniweb.unipd.it and on *Menu → Registration*.

At the end of the registration, you will receive an e-mail username and activation code with which to access the uniweb.unipd.it/password/index.php/it/utenti/identifica/azione/a page, where you will be asked to set three security questions and a password. With the username obtained and the password set, you can access your reserved area.

Registration on the www.uniweb.unipd.it portal can also be done using SPID credentials, by clicking on the *Menu → items Registrazione con SPID*.

3.2 Submitting the pre-enrolment application

To pre-enrol you must:

1. log in with your credentials to www.uniweb.unipd.it, click on the items *Home → Admission Test → Degree programme Type "Master's Degree programme"* and indicate the degree programme or the degree programmes for which you intend to compete. It is possible to apply for pre-enrolment for access to one or more of the degree programmes indicated in this call: for each pre-enrolment it is necessary to follow the instructions in full, paying the fee and submitting the necessary documentation.
2. enter the degree to be used for access to the degree programme, if not already present in the system.

Students enrolled at the University of Padua who are about to graduate can complete pre-enrolment only after submitting the online application for the degree. In the event that this application has not yet been submitted, in order to proceed, it is necessary to report your situation to immatricolazioni.studenti@unipd.it;

3. Pay the pre-enrolment fee of **€ 30.00** through the PagoPA procedure (instructions on page www.unipd.it/pago-pa).

4. KNOWLEDGE REQUIRED FOR ACCESS

To access the degree programmes, it is necessary to be in possession of specific minimum curricular requirements and adequate personal preparation, as indicated in the course teaching regulations. This knowledge is verified through the submission of a specific **application for assessment of the requirements** and according to what is indicated for each degree programme ([Annex 2](#)).

The procedure is only available after completing pre-enrolment ([point 3](#)):

on the dates scheduled for the selection ([point 2](#)).

5. ENROLMENT, DEGREE PROGRAMME CHANGE, TRANSFER FROM ANOTHER UNIVERSITY

5.1 Procedures

In order to enrol, change degree programme or transfer from another university, it is necessary to:

- have submitted the pre-enrolment application ([point 3](#));
- have submitted the application for assessment of the minimum curricular requirements ([point 4](#)) and be in possession of said requirements;
- submit the documentation for the language requirement ([Annex 3](#)) within the deadlines set by the selection;
- be "admitted (ammesso)" in the ranking;
- have registered the data of the obtained entry title. Registration is automatic for students who obtain the admission qualification at the University of Padua, while it must be completed manually for graduates from other universities in the Uniweb reserved area in the *Home* → *Titoli di accesso* section.

Admitted candidates who do not yet meet the **language requirement** ([Annex 3](#)) and/or who have not yet obtained the **admission qualification** may accept the place won **provisionally**.

Both of these requirements must be met **by July 31, 2026**.

The application for enrolment, change of degree programme or transfer from another university must be submitted

on the dates scheduled for each assignment ([point 2](#)).

Please note: the deadlines indicated for the acceptance of the place, for the payment of the first instalment of the fees, for the obtainment and update of the entry title and for submitting the required documents are peremptory. Failure to comply is equivalent to **renunciation of the place in the ranking** list and the cancellation of the enrolment application.

Those who have missed a deadline but are interested in a degree programme can submit an application for extraordinary enrolment which is evaluated at the end of the enrolment of the last scheduled selection. 5.3 Verification of the practical-evaluation internship for enrolled students

In order to obtain the master's degree qualifying for the practice of the profession of psychologist, it is necessary to have carried out practical-evaluation internship activities (TPV) for a total of 750 hours (30 CFU), of which 250 hours (10 CFU) carried out in the three-year degree and 500 hours (20 CFU) in the master's degree. Those who finalize their enrolment and who have not carried out a TPV of at least 10 credits in the three-year course must therefore recover, during the master's degree, TPV activities for 10 CFU, in excess of the 120 credits provided for by the degree programme.

6. PERSON IN CHARGE OF THE PROCEDURE, PERSONAL DATA, NOTES AND WARNINGS

1. Pursuant to art. 4 of Law 241 of 7 August 1990 (New rules on administrative procedure and right of access to administrative documents) and subsequent amendments, the responsible for the access to records procedure is the Head of the Ufficio Carriere Studenti, Dr. Maria Chiara Ferraresi.
2. Candidates have the right to access the documents relating to the competition procedure in accordance with the procedures set out in Presidential Decree No. 184 of 12 April 2006 (Regulations governing access to administrative documents in accordance with Chapter V of Law 241/90). Requests for access to documents must be submitted to the University of Padua.

3. Current legislation on declarations: in the event that the documentation submitted by the candidate shows false or misleading declarations, without prejudice to the sanctions provided for by the Criminal Code and the special laws on the subject (Articles 75 and 76 of Presidential Decree 445/2000), the candidate automatically loses his/her enrolment. The University will recover any benefits granted (e.g. scholarships) and will not proceed with any type of refund of the fees paid. Finally, the false declaration will result in the exposure to the action for damages by the counterparties.
4. Processing of personal data: the personal data provided by candidates, collected for the purposes identified in this Notice, are processed in compliance with the provisions of EU Regulation 27.04.2016, n. 679 (General Data Protection Regulation, GDPR) and the information available on page www.unipd.it/informativa-studenti.

ANNEX 1 – RECOGNITION OF CREDITS FOR CAREER SHORTENING

Recognition of previous credits

Those who intend to access the degree programme by requesting the recognition of credits must meet the requirements to access the first year ([point 1.2](#)), including deadlines and terms to be met, with no difference compared to those who access the first year without submitting the credit recognition application.

For the recognition of credits already acquired and the shortening of a career, a specific application for evaluation must also be submitted. Instructions and deadlines for proceeding are published on March 10, 2026 on page <https://www.unipd.it/ammissioni-psi-magistrali-linguainglese>.

The commission in charge issues a resolution containing the list of recognized training activities/credits and the proposed year of admission, with the following criterion:

- recognition **greater than or equal to 42 CFU** > proposed admission to the 2nd year.

For the purposes of counting the credits recognized for the year of admission, only exams already taken and registered by the end of the credit recognition application procedure are considered. Proposed admission to the 2nd year

Those who intend to access the degree programme by requesting the recognition of credits must meet the requirements to access the first year ([point 1.2](#)), including deadlines and terms to be met, with no difference compared to those who access the first year without submitting the credit recognition application.

By September 2026, based on the number of applications received and the number of places available for each year, a communication on the allocation of available places is published on page <https://www.unipd.it/ammissioni-psi-magistrali-linguainglese> :

- in the event that the number of eligible candidates is less than the number of places available, candidates are admitted to the proposed admission year;
- in the event that the number of candidates eligible for the 2nd year exceeds the available places, a ranking is drawn up in order of score, based on the credits and marks of the recognized exams. The score is calculated as follows:
 - The grade of each recognized exam is multiplied by the relative CFU (in the calculation, the grade 30/30 laude is counted as 33);
 - the products thus obtained are then added³;

In the event of a tie, priority is given to the youngest candidate.

For the purposes of drawing up the ranking, only exams that have been recognized and already taken and registered by the end of the credit application procedure are considered.

Eligible⁴ and *non-admitted⁵* candidates can only enrol in the 1st year by participating in the selections as indicated in [point 1.2](#), with no difference compared to those who access the first year without submitting the credit recognition application.

After receiving the resolution of recognition of credits and being admitted to any rankings for access to **years subsequent to the first**, the deadlines for completing the procedures for access to the degree programmes are as follows:

- enrolment: from the day of publication of the ranking list and by 30 September 2026 (full day);
- incoming transfer: from the day of publication of the ranking list and by 30 September 2026 (full day);
- Degree programme change: from 1 September (or from the day of publication of the ranking list, if later) to 30 September 2026 (full day).

Instructions for completing enrolment, transfer or degree programme change after receiving the credit recognition resolution are available on page www.unipd.it/istruzioniaccesso-triennali-magistrali-ciclounico.

Admission is carried out in order of ranking; in the event that places become available following the withdrawal by successful students, further scrolling by direct call by the Settore Immatricolazioni e Prove di Accesso will be carried out, in any case no later than 31 October 2026.

³ By way of example, an example with three exams is proposed: exam A (6 credits) grade 24; exam B (9 credits) grade 30; exam C (6 credits) mark 27. The sum of the products of CFU and grade of each exam is: [(24 x 6) + (30 x 9) + (27 x 6)] = 576

⁴ A candidate is eligible if in the resolution the commission proposes admission to the 2nd year.

⁵ A candidate is admitted if, in addition to being suitable, he or she is in a useful position in the ranking.

APPLIED CHILD AND ADOLESCENT PSYCHOLOGY

Curricular requirements

To compete for access to the degree programme, it is necessary to meet all the following requirements:

- **Entry title:** Bachelor's degree in Psychological Sciences and Techniques L-24 (DM 270/04) or in class 34 - Psychological Sciences and Techniques (DM 509/99), to be obtained **by 31 July 2026**
- **Minimum grade:** arithmetic average greater than or equal to 25/30 in the exams passed in the three-year course and belonging to the SSD: M-PSI/03; M-PSI/04; M-PSI/05
- **Knowledge of the English language at level B2 or higher** ([Annex 3](#))

How to access

The ranking list is formed on the basis of the arithmetic average grade reported in the courses pertaining to the following SSD: M-PSI/03; M-PSI/04; M-PSI/05

The final score of each candidate is expressed in hundredths (0-100) and is given by the normalization on a basis of 100 of the highest scores obtained by candidates with an Italian and foreign qualification.

To be included in the ranking it is necessary to score **greater than or equal to 60/100**.

In the event of a tie, priority is given to the youngest candidate.

CLINICAL, SOCIAL AND INTERCULTURAL PSYCHOLOGY

Curricular requirements

To compete for access to the degree programme, it is necessary to meet all the following requirements:

- **Entry title:** Bachelor's degree in Psychological Sciences and Techniques L-24 (DM 270/04) or in class 34 - Psychological Sciences and Techniques (DM 509/99), to be obtained **by 31 July 2026**. Alternatively, it is possible to access with a degree belonging to a different class (to be obtained **by 31 July 2026**) and being in possession of a minimum of 88 credits of exams belonging to the SSD M-PSI/01, M-PSI/02, M-PSI/03, M-PSI/04, M-PSI/05, M-PSI/06, M-PSI/07, M-PSI/08, of which a minimum of 4 credits must have been obtained in each of the SSD indicated. The credits are considered for this purpose only if certified as already obtained at the time of application;
- **Minimum grade – arithmetic average:** arithmetic average greater than or equal to 25/30 calculated on all the SSDs provided for by the qualification used for access to the course;
- **Minimum grade – final grade:** minimum grade of the degree used for admission equal to 95/110 or equivalent;
- **Knowledge of the English language at level B2 or higher** ([Annex 3](#))

How to access

The ranking list is formed on the basis of the degree grade or on the average of the exams taken to obtain the qualification for access to the course of study.

For the evaluation and attribution of the score, it is necessary to fill in a special form, available on page www.unipd.it/ammissioni-psi-magistrali-linguainglese. The form must be attached when applying for the selection, as indicated in [point 4](#).

In the event of a tie, work, internship and research experience as stated in the evaluation form is taken into account.

In the event of a further tie, priority is given to the youngest candidate.

COGNITIVE NEUROSCIENCE AND CLINICAL NEUROPSYCHOLOGY

Curricular requirements

To compete for access to the degree programme, it is necessary to meet all the following requirements:

- **Entry title:** Bachelor's degree in Psychological Sciences and Techniques L-24 (DM 270/04) or in class 34 - Psychological Sciences and Techniques (DM 509/99), to be obtained **by 31 July 2026**;
- **Minimum credits:** possession of a minimum of 50 credits of exams belonging to the SSD M-PSI/01, M-PSI/02, M-PSI/03. Only certified credits as already obtained at the time of application are considered;
- **Minimum grade:** arithmetic average greater than or equal to 25/30, calculated on the basis of the overall average of the exams of the admission qualification taken at the time of application;
- **Knowledge of the English language at level B2 or higher** ([attachment 3](#)).

An analysis of the previous course of study **is also carried out**, with particular attention to the programs of the courses of SSD M-PSI/01, M-PSI/02, M-PSI/03.

How to access

The ranking list is formed on the basis of the evaluation of the documentation of the academic career (Tor) and the evaluation form available on page www.unipd.it/ammissioni-psi-magistrali-linguainglese.

The form must be attached when applying for the selection, as indicated in [point 4](#). Specifically, the following scores are awarded:

- **Arithmetic average marks:** from 0 to 30 points, awarded on the basis of the overall average of the exams of the admission qualification taken at the time of application;
- **Congruence:** from 0 to 40 points, awarded on the basis of the congruence of the exams taken with respect to the knowledge required to access the course (General Psychology, Psychobiology and Physiological Psychology, Psychometrics);
- **Activities:** up to 30 points, awarded on the basis of the type, duration and relevance of the activities carried out at the time of application (work experience, internship, research, mobility, publications) with respect to the knowledge required to access the course (General Psychology, Psychobiology and Physiological Psychology, Psychometrics).

The final score of each candidate is expressed in hundredths (0-100) and is given by the sum of the scores in the sections reported.

To be included in the ranking it is necessary to score **greater than or equal to 60/100**.

In the event of a tie, priority is given to the youngest candidate.

ANNEX 3 – LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

To be admitted to the course, it is necessary to have and demonstrate a knowledge of the English language of level equal to or higher than B2 (CEFR).

The requirement must be met **by 31 July 2026** in one of the following ways:

Alternative 1:	<p>Possession of a language certification of level B2 or higher. The list of accepted certifications and the score thresholds to refer to are indicated on page www.unipd.it/requisito-inglese-ammissione. Certificates obtained on or after January 1, 2021 are accepted.</p> <p><i>Required documentation</i> It is necessary to attach the certification, both sides of the page, within the procedure (point 4). Those who have taken the test and have not yet received the certificate can present the provisional statement of results issued by the certifying body.</p>
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Or

Alternative 2:	<p>Be a native English speaker. A native speaker is considered to be a person who has an identity document indicating one of the following nationalities (dual citizenship is also considered valid in this sense): Antigua and Barbuda, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Canada, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Ireland, Jamaica, Malta, New Zealand, St Kitts and Nevis, St Lucia, St Vincent and the Grenadines, Trinidad and Tobago, United Kingdom, USA.</p> <p><i>Required documentation</i> It is necessary to attach an identity document in the appropriate section of the procedure that shows the possession of the citizenship in question.</p>

Alternative 3:	<p>Possession of a qualification of a degree programme entirely taught in English. The qualifications accepted are bachelor's degree, single-cycle master's degree, master's degree, or equivalent (foreign qualifications or previous systems); <u>it is not enough to have completed part of the course abroad</u>.</p> <p><i>Required documentation</i> The achievement of the degree must be demonstrated by attaching the self-certification with exams or the diploma supplement provided by the university in which it was obtained within the procedure (point 4)</p> <p>If the qualification in question (<u>presented for the sole purpose of passing the language requirement</u>) was obtained abroad, the Transcript of Records and the final diploma of achievement are required.</p> <p>In any case, the document must explicitly indicate the language of delivery of the course. Otherwise, it is necessary to attach an official document issued by the university certifying the language of delivery of the course.</p>
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
