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1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Selections are open for admission to the first year of the Master's Degree Programmes with limited access of the Scuola di Scienze Umane, Sociali e del Patrimonio Culturale¹ indicated in the table below, for the academic year 2026/27. The degree programme is delivered in English.

This document is an integral part of the call for the selection of Italian, EU or equivalent candidates, **with an Italian admission qualification**.

Places reserved for non-EU candidates residing abroad who remain vacant due to a complete scrolling of the rankings are put up for competition in the first useful scrolling of the ranking list for EU or equivalent candidates.

1.2 Admission requirements

To be eligible, candidates must:

1. obtain a **three-year degree in Italy or an equivalent foreign qualification** by 31 July 2026², according to current legislation.
2. Be in possession of the **curricular requirements** and **personal preparation** required, as indicated in [point 4](#);
3. **Participate in the selection** process by following the procedures and deadlines indicated in [point 2](#);
4. **Be admitted**: the ranking list and any assignments and repechages are published on the dates and pages provided for by each selection;

¹ The activation of the first year of the courses of study is subject to their accreditation in accordance with the provisions of Ministerial Decree 1154/2021 "Self-assessment, evaluation, initial and periodic accreditation of locations and courses of study"; therefore the course will not be activated in the event of non-accreditation. 5. **Enrolment:** admitted candidates must submit an application for enrolment, change of degree programme or transfer from another university within the peremptory deadlines set by each selection.

1.3 Criteria for the formation of the admission ranking list

The admission ranking lists are determined in order of score, on the basis of the following criteria:

- For candidates in possession of a degree belonging to classes L-19, L-20, L-24, L-36, L-40 (DM 270/04) or corresponding classes pursuant to DM 509/99, obtained by the deadline for pre-enrolment for access to the selection: final grade obtained in the degree;
- For candidates in possession of a degree belonging to classes L-19, L-20, L-24, L-36, L-40 (DM 270/2004) or corresponding classes pursuant to DM 509/99, obtained after the closing of pre-enrolment for access to the selection: the arithmetic average of the exams in the degree being obtained, taken and registered by the pre-enrolment deadline;
- For candidates in possession of a degree belonging to classes other than those referred to in the previous point: the arithmetic average of the exams in the referred to in [point 4.2](#), taken and recorded by the closing date of pre-enrolment. In the event of possession of a number of useful credits (CFU/ECTS) greater than 24, the exams with the highest grade - up to the established limit - are taken into consideration.

Only the credits indicated in the documentation sent when submitting the application are considered.

The final ranking is drawn up in order of score on a basis of 100 by normalizing the degree grades and arithmetic averages as described for the three cases proposed.

In the event of a tie, priority is given to the youngest candidate.

2. SELECTIONS: DEADLINES AND DEADLINES TO BE MET

2.1 Selection: deadlines and procedures

Candidates who do not yet possess the entry title may participate in the selection provisionally, with the obligation to obtain the entry title **by 31 July 2026**.

To participate in the selection and access the degree programme it is necessary to:

1. **pre-enrol** ([point 3](#)) in the period **10 March – 10 April 2026** (full day);
2. submit the application for **assessment of curricular requirements** in the period **10 March – 10 April 2026** (full day) ([point 4](#));
3. **submit the required language documentation** ([Annex 2](#)) by **31 July 2026**;

4. **Be admitted:** the rankings of each degree programme and subsequent assignments are published on the dates and pages indicated in the table below. The publication has the value of official communication to candidates;

5. **enrol:** the application for enrolment, change of degree programme or transfer from another university must be submitted within the deadlines indicated in the table below. The procedures to be followed are indicated in [point 5](#).

Candidates who, at the time of the assignment of the place in the ranking list, do not yet meet the **language requirement** and/or who have not yet obtained the **entry title** are **provisionally admitted**.

Both of these requirements must be met **by July 31, 2026**.

3.1 Registration on the Uniweb portal

If you are accessing Uniweb for the first time, you must create a new account by clicking on www.uniweb.unipd.it and on *Menu → Registration*.

At the end of the registration, you will receive an e-mail username and activation code with which to access the uniweb.unipd.it/password/index.php/it/utenti/identifica/azione/a page, where you will be asked to set three security questions and a password. With the username obtained and the password set, you can access your reserved area.

Registration on the www.uniweb.unipd.it portal can also be done using SPID credentials, by clicking on the *Menu → items Registrazione con SPID*.

3.2 Submitting the pre-enrolment application

To pre-enrol you must:

1. log in with your credentials to www.uniweb.unipd.it, click on the *items Home → Admission Test → Degree programme Type "Master's Degree programme" → Social Sciences and Digital Data*;
2. enter the degree to be used for access to the degree programme, if not already present in the system.

Students enrolled at the University of Padua who are about to graduate can complete the pre-enrolment application only after submitting the online application for the degree. In the event that this application has not yet been submitted, in order to proceed, it is necessary to report your situation to immatricolazioni.studenti@unipd.it;

3. at the same time, pay the pre-enrolment fee of **€ 30.00** through the PagoPA procedure (instructions on page www.unipd.it/pago-pa).

4. KNOWLEDGE REQUIRED FOR ACCESS

4.1 Procedures

To access the degree programme, it is necessary to be in possession of specific minimum curricular requirements and adequate personal preparation, as indicated in the degree programme regulations. For the verification of this knowledge, it is necessary to meet the requirements as set out in the following point (4.2) by submitting the required documents, if necessary.

The procedure is available only after completing pre-enrolment ([point 3](#)) on the dates set for the selection ([point 2](#)).

The **instructions** for submitting the application for assessment of the minimum curricular requirements are published on 10 March 2026 on page <https://www.unipd.it/ammisioni-scu-social-science-digital-data>.

4.2 Minimum curricular requirements and personal preparation

This requirement must be met as indicated by **at least one of the two proposed alternatives**:

- a. possession of a degree in classes L-19, L-20, L-24, L-36, L-40 (DM 270/04) or a degree in the corresponding classes of DM 509/99
- b. achievement of at least 24 University Credits (CFU/ECTS) divided as follows in the following SSDs:
 - at least 18 CFUs: SPS/01 (GSPS-01/A); SPS/02 (GSPS-03/A); SPS/04 (GSPS-02/A); SPS/07 (GSPS-05/A); SPS/08 (GSPS-06/A); SPS/09 (GSPS-08/A); SPS/10 (GSPS-08/B); SPS/11 (GSPS-07/A); SPS/12 (GSPS-07/A);
 - at least 6 CFUs: SECS-S/01 (STAT-01/A); SECS-S/03 (STAT-02/A); SECS-S/05 (STAT-03/B); M-PSI/03 (PSIC-01/C).

All candidates are required to have obtained a three-year degree in Italy or an equivalent foreign qualification³, with the following mark:

Minimum grade	greater than or equal to 99/110
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All candidates are required to possess the following language skills:

English language	Level B2 or higher

5. ENROLMENT, CHANGE OF DEGREE PROGRAMME, TRANSFER FROM ANOTHER UNIVERSITY

5.1 Procedures

In order to enrol, change degree programmes or transfer from another university, it is necessary to:

- have submitted the pre-enrolment application ([point 3](#));
- have submitted the application for assessment of the minimum curricular requirements ([point 4](#)) and be in possession said requirements;
- submit the documentation for the language requirement ([Annex 2](#)) within the deadlines set by the selection;
- be "admitted (ammesso)" in the ranking;

- have registered the data of the obtained entry title. Registration is automatic for students who obtain the admission qualification at the University of Padua, while it must be completed manually for graduates from other universities in the Uniweb reserved area in the *Home* → *Titoli di accesso* section.

Admitted candidates who do not yet meet the **language requirement** ([Annex 2](#)) and/or who have not yet obtained the **admission qualification** may accept the place won **provisionally**.

Both of these requirements must be met **by July 31, 2026**.

The application for enrolment, change of degree programme or transfer from another university must be submitted

on the dates scheduled for each assignment ([point 2](#)).

Please note: the deadlines indicated for the acceptance of the place, for the payment of the first instalment of the fees, for the obtainment and update of the entry title and for submitting the required documents are peremptory. Those who have missed a deadline but are interested in the degree programme can submit an application for extraordinary enrolment which is assessed at the end of the enrolment of the last scheduled selection. 6. PERSON IN CHARGE OF THE PROCEDURE, PERSONAL DATA, NOTES AND WARNINGS

1. Pursuant to art. 4 of Law 241 of 7 August 1990 (New rules on administrative procedure and right of access to administrative documents) and subsequent amendments, the responsible for the access to records procedure is the Head of the Ufficio Carriere Studenti, Dr. Maria Chiara Ferraresi.
2. Candidates have the right to access the documents relating to the competition procedure in accordance with the procedures set out in Presidential Decree No. 184 of 12 April 2006 (Regulations governing access to administrative documents in accordance with Chapter V of Law 241/90). Requests for access to documents must be submitted to the University of Padua.
3. Current legislation on declarations: in the event that the documentation submitted by the candidate shows false or misleading declarations, without prejudice to the sanctions provided for by the Criminal Code and the special laws on the subject (Articles 75 and 76 of Presidential Decree 445/2000), the candidate automatically loses his/her enrolment. The University will recover any benefits granted (e.g. scholarships) and will not proceed with any type of refund of the fees paid. Finally, the false declaration will result in the exposure to the action for damages by the counterparties.

ANNEX 1 – RECOGNITION OF CREDITS FOR CAREER SHORTENING

Recognition of previous credits

Those who intend to access the degree programme by requesting the recognition of credits must meet the requirements to access the first year ([point 1.2](#)), including deadlines and terms to be met, with no difference compared to those who access the first year without submitting the credit recognition application.

For the recognition of credits already obtained and the shortening of a career, a specific application for evaluation must also be submitted. Instructions and deadlines for proceeding are published on March 10, 2026 on page <https://www.unipd.it/ammissioni-scu-social-science-digital-data>.

The commission in charge issues a resolution containing the list of recognized activities/credits and the proposed year of admission, with the following criterion:

- recognition **greater than or equal to 45 CFU** > proposed admission to the 2nd year.

For the purposes of counting the credits recognized for the year of admission, only exams already taken and registered by the end of the credit recognition application procedure are considered. More information is available in the teaching regulations of the degree programme of interest (https://www.unipd.it/corsi?ss360Query=*>), regarding:

- Evaluation criteria and methods for the recognition of exams (art. 10)
- criteria and procedures for access to years subsequent to the first (art. 9)

Proposed admission to the 2nd year

The admission requirements to be met remain the same as those indicated in this call for admission ([point 1.2](#)), with no difference from those who enter the first year without having obtained the recognition of credits.

By September 2026, based on the number of applications received and the number of places available for each year, a communication on the allocation of available places is published on page <https://www.unipd.it/ammissioni-scu-social-science-digital-data> :

- in the event that the number of eligible candidates is less than the number of places available, candidates are admitted to the proposed admission year;

- in the event that the number of candidates eligible for the 2nd year exceeds the available places, a ranking list is formed in order of score, based on the number of credits recognized.
In the event of a tie, priority is given to the youngest candidate.

Only exams that have been recognized and already taken and registered by the end of the credit application procedure are considered for the ranking list.

*Eligible*⁴ and *non-admitted*⁵ candidates can only enrol in the 1st year by participating in the selections as indicated in [point 1.2](#), without any difference from those who have not submitted the application for credit recognition.

After receiving the resolution of recognition of credits and being admitted to any rankings for access to **years subsequent to the first**, the deadlines for completing the procedures for access to the degree programmes are as follows:

- enrolment: from the day of publication of the ranking list and by 30 September 2026 (full day);
- incoming transfer: from the day of publication of the ranking list and by 30 September 2026 (full day);
- Degree programme change: from 1 September (or from the day of publication of the ranking list, if later) to 30 September 2026 (full day).

Admission is carried out in order of ranking; in the event that places become available following the withdrawal by successful students, further scrollings will be carried out by direct call by the Settore Immatricolazioni e Prove di Accesso, in any case no later than 31 October 2026.

ANNEX 2 – LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

To be admitted to the degree programme, it is necessary to have and demonstrate a knowledge of the English language of level equal to or higher than B2 (CEFR).

The requirement must be met **by 31 July 2026** in one of the following ways:

Alternative 1:	<p>Possession of a language certification of level B2 or higher. The list of accepted certifications and the score thresholds to refer to are indicated on page www.unipd.it/requisito-inglese-ammissione. Certificates obtained on or after January 1, 2021 are accepted.</p> <p><i>Required documentation</i> It is necessary to attach the certification, front and back, within the procedure (point 4.1). Those who have taken the test and have not yet received the certificate can present the provisional statement of results issued by the certifying body.</p>
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Or

Alternative 2:	<p>Be a native English speaker. A native speaker is considered to be a person who has an identity document indicating one of the following nationalities (dual citizenship is also considered valid in this sense): Antigua and Barbuda, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Canada, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Ireland, Jamaica, Malta, New Zealand, St Kitts and Nevis, St Lucia, St Vincent and the Grenadines, Trinidad and Tobago, United Kingdom, USA.</p> <p><i>Required documentation</i> It is necessary to attach in the appropriate section of the procedure (point 4.1) an identity document showing the possession of the citizenship in question.</p>
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Or

Alternative 3:	<p>Possession of a qualification of a degree programme entirely taught in English. The qualifications accepted are: high school diploma, bachelor's degree, single-cycle master's degree, master's degree, or equivalent (foreign qualifications or previous systems). <u>It is not enough to have completed part of the degree programme abroad.</u></p> <p><i>Required documentation</i> The achievement of the degree must be demonstrated by attaching the self-certification with exams or the diploma supplement provided by the university in which it was obtained within the procedure (point 4.1).</p> <p>If the qualification in question (<u>submitted for the sole purpose of passing the language requirement</u>) was obtained abroad, the Transcript of Records and the final diploma of achievement are required.</p> <p>In any case, the document must explicitly indicate the language of delivery of the degree programme. Otherwise, it is necessary to attach an official document issued by the university certifying the language of delivery of the degree programme.</p>
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Or

Alternative 4:

Possession of an **open badge** issued by an **Italian university** or a certificate from a **Language Centre (CLA) of an Italian university**⁶.

Required documentation

The certificate or open badge must be attached in the appropriate section of the procedure ([point 4.1](#)). It is specified that:

- The **language certificate** must be written on the letterhead of the Language Centre of the Italian University that issued it, must contain the student's personal details and must clearly indicate that the student has passed a **B2 level test** or higher taken at the same University Language Centre (Italian) that issued it.
Alternatively, within the procedure, it is possible to self-declare that you have passed the test provided by the university language centre for the level of English required. It is necessary to upload a file containing your personal details, the date of passing the test, the name of the university language center where the test was taken and the contacts of the center in question or the office that manages the delivery of the test (email address and telephone number) for the necessary checks on what has been declared.
- the **open badge** must contain the student's personal details and must show the level of the exam, **B2 or higher**; **You can attach the pdf of the Open Badge or a document that shows the link (URL) in which it can be consulted.**
