The initiative/s



- International PBL (2020-2021)
 - Call "Shaping a World-class University Seed funding for Digitalization & Innovation" (January 2021)
 - online July 2021
 - Problem Based Learning (PBL) approach 4 ECTS for students
 - 12 students, 11 teachers, 3 facilitators
- iPLEX Vet Med (2021-2022)
 - New Erasmus+ Program 2021-2027 -> BIP
 - Blended May and July 2022
 - iPLEX Vet Med (international Problem-based Learning EXperience in Veterinary Medicine) – Educational offer – 4 ECTS for students and teachers
 - 24 students, 10 teachers, 4 facilitators

Aims of the initiative



- To promote international mobility among veterinary students, both long-term and short-term (Short mobility = Blended Intensive Program)
- To promote Internationalisation at home and Virtual exchange
- To expose veterinary students to student-centred learning environment to improve their acquisition of the soft-skill
 - Group work, problem-solving, public speaking





Preparation and promotion of the initiative



- Preparation of the initiative
 - Online and in-presence meetings
 - Program definition (e.g. time zones, ...)
 - Case study definition (teachers subgroups)
 - Student Assessment strategy
- Promotion of the initiative
 - Communication and recruitment of students
 - Social media vs. official messages
 - Formal application in Moodle motivational letter
 - Student selection
 - Letter and interview (in English) + curriculum
 - Motivated students apply!

NEGATIVE ASPECTS



- All steps in ONE day is too much




