Welcome to the Library, open 24/7 Since 2015

<u>The University Library</u> Students' preferred working place outside the classroom



Extensive guidance and teaching activity:250 courses with about 4.800 participants and600 individual guidances a year plus 17.000 requestsat the library help desk.

We have increased our number of visitors from about 250.000 per year to 500.000 since 2014.

On a normal day 2.000 students visit the library


Comics Corner 2022

They are responsible for physical events, animations, social media: Facebook, Twitter, Instagram (to reach out to as many as possible).






Results of working strategically on the learning environment
